Two tier process:

i) establish a base in these institutions ensuring cricket is a fixed part of the curriculum and lunch/after school activities.

ii) create a competition structure both in school within internal 'houses' leading to representative school matches with schools playing each other As with all facilities that Guernsey Cricket have access to these are subject to agreements of varying terms.

Recent change of use to indoor facilities used as left us short of required space

See long term agreement with secure space suitable to needs

Men ranking currently = 36

Women have not yet achieved a ranking through quantum of games played

Regular and appropriate T20I schedules to be put in pace each year for both teams

Need to understand how re-entry can be gained with the next rotation of CWC (or any replacement structure) and gear planning to secure our place Coaches – ease of access to education/well-being/first aid programmes with in-house options leading to ICC/ECB courses.

Equipment – create links to distributors affording discounts to schools, Clubs and Members.

CLUB CRICKET

Adult cricket is split into 3 Evening League divisions containing 25 teams across the 3 divisions. The top division is formed of 6 teams and the second and third division have 9 teams in each.

Weekend League cricket is split into 2 divisions, the top division (50 Over) containing 3 teams and the lower division (40 Over) containing 6 teams.



A TEAM CRICKET INT

To bridge the step from club cricket into International cricket, 2021 saw the introduction of the Guernsey A Team.

This squad is made up pf the best league cricketers and cricketers who have aspirations of playing for Guernse in International competitions.

They will have the opportunity to play games against visiting sides such as Holland A and Sussex Academy.

INTERNATIONAL CRICKET

The National team have now gained International T20 status. This is the pinnacle of Guernsey Cricket. The National squad are regularly fitness tested along with regular training both in a 1 on 1 and group environment. Currently ranked 36 in the World.

In addition to the men's there is a thriving Ladies section who are also playing International Cricket.
